STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT for the better protection of fish in Lake Auburn in
the city of Auburn, in Androscoggin county.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. No person shall fish for or take fish of any
2 kind, from Lake Auburn, otherwise known as Wilson
3 pond, in the city of Auburn, in Androscoggin county,
4 between the first day of October and the first day of May
5 following in each year for the term of six years.

SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this
2 act shall be punished by a fine of five dollars for each
3 offence, and five dollars additional for each fish taken, to
4 be recovered by complaint before the municipal court of
5 the city of Auburn, one-half to the use of the prosecutor,

6 and one-half to the city of Auburn, or by imprisonment
7 not more than sixty days.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
