STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Summit Plantation.

Resolved, That there be paid by the treasurer of state
2 out of the school funds of the current year, to Summit
3 Plantation, the sum of fifty-two dollars and ten cents, it
4 being a balance equitably due said town as its proportion
5 of the school funds for the year eighteen hundred ninety-
6 two.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Summit Plantation organized March 24, 1891, and had never done town business this fact accounts for their not notifying the secretary of state until too late to obtain blanks from the superintendent of schools and make returns in the limited time.

The returns, when made, showed that they had raised and expended school money legally, and therefore were entitled to their proportion of the state tax.
