STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in aid in rebuilding bridge in Hamlin Plantation.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the
2 sum of three hundred dollars to be expended under the
3 direction of an agent to be appointed by the Governor and
4 Council, in rebuilding the bridge across Bonny brook, so
5 called, in Hamlin plantation, in Aroostook county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Hamlin plantation has a valuation of only \$72,000. There are eight bridges within its limits, five of them costing from \$50 to \$100, and three costing from \$500 to \$600. One of these across Bonny brook, in said plantation, has become unsafe for travel, and must be rebuilt the coming season at a cost of about \$500. The expense of rebuilding this bridge in addition to that of maintaining the other bridges in the plantation and the ordinary taxes, will be a heavy burden upon the citizens of that plantation, and the State should, as they think, assist them in the construction of the bridge to be rebuilt, to the extent of \$300.
