STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT additional to Chapter one hundred and sixty-four
of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and
ninety-one relating to the taking of trout and landlocked
salmon from Anasagunticook Lake in the towns of Canton
and Hartford.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. All persons are prohibited hereby to take
2 fish of any kind, from the tributaries of Anasagunticook
3 lake or Whitney pond, so called, in Canton and Hartford,
4 for a term of six years.

SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of the
2 foregoing section of this act, shall be liable to a fine of
3 five dollars for each fish so taken, to be recovered on com-

4 plaint before any trial justice in the county of Oxford,
5 one-half to the complainant and one-half to the town
6 where the offense is committed.

SECT. 3. All persons are prohibited hereby from tak-
2 ing fish of any kind, in any manner, through the ice in
3 Anasagunticook lake or Whitney pond, so called, in the
4 towns of Canton and Hartford, for a term of six years.

SECT. 4. Any person violating the provisions of section
2 three of this act, shall be liable to a fine of ten dollars,
3 and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish so taken,
4 to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in
5 the county of Oxford, one-half to the complainant and
6 one-half to the town of Canton.
