STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and seventy of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, entitled "An Act to amend chapter one hundred and seventy-nine of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, entitled 'An Act for the protection of trout in Cathance Lake, Washington County."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The fifth line of said chapter is hereby amended by strik-

- 2 ing out the words "October" and "June" and inserting
- 3 in their respective places the words 'September' and 'May',
- 4 so that said chapter as amended shall read as follows:
 - 'Section 2. If any person shall fish with hook and line,
- 6 gaff, seine, or with any other tackle in Cathance lake or

- 7 its tributary brooks or streams in the town of Cooper and
 8 Plantation Number Fourteen, Eastern Division, in Wash9 ington county, between the first day of September and
 10 the last day of May, he shall forfeit three dollars; and if
 11 any person shall take or destroy any trout in said lake or
 12 its tributary brooks or streams during the time aforesaid,
 13 he shall forfeit the sum of five dollars for each trout so
 14 taken or destroyed, and if any person shall put into said
 15 lake or its tributary brooks or streams, any pike or
 16 pickerel or any other fish destructive to trout, he shall
 17 forfeit fifty dollars, said penalties to be recovered in
 18 action of debt, one-half thereof to the town or plantation
- 19 where the offense is committed and one-half to the com-20 plainant; and in default of payment he shall be committed
- 21 to the county jail for a term of six months, or until the
- 22 same is paid.'
