STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Bloomfield Academy.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be hereby

- 2 appropriated annually for the term of ten years, to
- 3 Bloomfield Academy, an institution of learning located
- 4 in the town of Skowhegan, in the county of Somerset,
- 5 provided, however, that this appropriation is made upon
- 6 the express condition that the town of Skowhegan shall
- 7 either erect a school building or enlarge the one now
- 8 occupied by said school, within two years after the
- 9 passage of this resolve, sufficiently to provide room
- 10 capable of accommodating all scholars who may attend
- 11 the same, including those outside of said town, who pay
- 12 no tuition, as by the terms of the bequest of the late ex-

- 13 Gov. Coburn; and also that the trustees of said institu-
- 14 tion, shall maintain and keep in operation a school equal
- 15 in rank and grade of teaching with a first-class academy,
- 16 of not less than three terms of ten weeks each, during
- 17 each year.
- 18 ' And provided further, that the Governor and Council
- 19 and superintendent of schools of the State shall have a right
- 20 at all times to visit said school when the same shall be in
- 21 operation, and if in the opinion of the Governor and
- 22 Council said institution shall at any time hereafter fail to
- 23 fulfil the conditions of this resolve, they may in their
- 24 discretion, withhold the appropriation herein granted.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The late Ex-Governor Coburn left by will to this Academy, a bequest, the income of which was to be used in support of this institution, on condition that all scholars outside the town of Skowhegan wishing to attend could do so free of tuition.

The building is not sufficient to accommodate the applicants. An addition is necessary and the petitioners ask that the sum asked for be given them so that they can continue the school, and have the benefit of the bequest in maintaining the same. Which unless granted, would have to be abandoned and the scholars outside of Skowhegan would have to seek elsewhere for their education.
