STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to incorporate the Black Brook Improvement Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. G. C. Moses, E. Plummer, F. H. Twitchell,

- 2 W. E. Plummer and William H. Newell, and their asso-
- 3 ciates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated
- 4 under the name of the Black Brook Improvement Com-
- 5 pany, with all the privileges and subject to the liabilities
- 6 incident to corporations of a similar nature.
 - SECT. 2. The capital stock of said company shall not
- 2 exceed five thousand dollars, and the Androscoggin Water
- 3 Power Company is hereby authorized to hold stock in said
- 4 corporation.

- SECT. 3. Said corporation is hereby authorized to
- 2 improve Black Brook, so called, in the township of
- 3 Andover, North Surplus and town of Andover, in the
- 4 County of Oxford, from its source to its junction with
- 5 Ellis river, so called, for log driving purposes, by widen-
- 6 ing, deepening and removing obstructions from the
- 7 channel of said brook, by the construction of dams, side
- 8 dams and sluiceways therein, and by the erection of
- 9 booms, side booms and piers therein, to facilitate the
- 10 floating of logs and pulp wood.
 - SECT. 4. For any materials taken for the purposes
 - 2 aforesaid, reasonable compensation shall be made to the
 - 3 owners thereof, to be ascertained in the same manner and
 - 4 under the same conditions as is provided in the case of
 - 5 damages by laying out of public highways; and for
 - 6 any damages by flowage reasonable compensation shall
- 7 be made to the parties injured, to be ascertained in the
- 8 same manner as is now provided in cases of flowing lands
- 9 by erection of dams and mills.
- Sect. 5. After the improvements contemplated by this
- 2 act shall have been made in said brook, and during such
- 3 time as the same shall be kept in proper condition to
- 4 reasonably accommodate the passage of logs and pulp
- 5 wood, the said corporation may demand and receive
- 6 twenty-five cents per thou-and feet, wood scale, for all
- 7 long lumber and saw logs, and five cents per cord for all
- 8 spruce, pine or poplar wood in four or eight feet lengths,
- 9 intended for pulp wood, that shall be floated down said

- 10 brook, through and past the improvements made by said
- 11 corporation under this charter.
 - Sect. 6. Said corporation shall have a lien on said
- 2 lumber and wood for said toll, to be enforced by attach-
- 3 ment, and suit to be begun within ninety days after the
- 4 same shall have arrived at its destination.
 - SECT. 7. Said corporation shall have the right to col-
 - 2 lect tolls upon all lumber and pulp wood which shall be
- 3 floated down said brook, through and by its said works,
- 4 until the amount collected shall be sufficient to pay the
- 5 cost of all improvements actually made on said stream,
- 6 with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per
- 7 annum, after which time said toll shall be reduced to a
- 8 sum sufficient to keep said improvements in suitable
- 9 repair, and pay for additions made thereto, from time to
- 10 time, as needed to facilitate log driving.
- SECT. 8. Said corporation shall keep at its office an
- 2 account of all moneys paid out for said improvements
- 3 upon said stream, and all moneys received as toll for lum-
- 4 ber or pulp wood, floated down said stream, and the same
- 5 shall be open at all reasonable times to the inspection of
- 6 all timber land owners upon said stream, or persons
- 7 actually engaged in driving lumber or pulp wood down
- 8 said stream.
 - SECT. 9. Said corporation shall organize and make the
- 2 improvements contemplated under this act within two
- 3 years from its approval, or the same shall be forfeited.
 - SECT. 10. This act shall take effect when approved.
