IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT for the protection of Trout and Land-locked
Salmon in Little Rattlesnake pond and its tributaries in
the town of Raymond in Cumberland county.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. All persons are forbidden fishing for, or
2 taking in any manner, any trout or land-locked salmon
3 from Little Rattlesnake pond or any of its tributaries, in
4 the town of Raymond, County of Cumberland, for the
5 period of four years.

SECT. 2. Whoever violates the provisions of this act,
2 shall be liable to a penalty of five dollars for each and
3 every trout or land-locked salmon so taken, to be recovered
4 on complaint before any trial justice in said county, one-

5 half to the use of the complainant and one-half to the use
6 of the county.
