STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT for the better Protection of Fish in Burnt Land
Pond in the Town of Deer Isle, in Hancock County.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. No person shall fish for or take fish of any
2 kind, from Burnt Land Pond, in the town of Deer Isle, in
3 Hancock county, for the term of five years.

SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this
2 act shall be punished by a fine of five dollars for each
3 offence, and five dollars additional for each fish taken, to
4 be recovered by complaint before any trial justice in the
5 town of Deer Isle, one-half to the use of the prosecutor,
6 and one-half to the town of Deer Isle, or by imprisonment
7 not more than sixty days.
