STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT for the Protection of Trout and Land-Locked Salmon in certain waters of the Rangeley Chain of Lakes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. No person shall take, catch, fish for or 2 destroy any trout or land-locked salmon in any of the 3 streams flowing into Rangeley lake, or in Ross pond, at 4 any time; nor in Round, Dodge or Kemankeag ponds 5 from October first to May fifteenth; nor in the Rangeley 6 stream from the lower wharf at the outlet of Rangeley 7 lake to the foot of the Rangeley dam of the Union Water 8 Power Company, at any time; nor in Whetstone brook 9 which flows into Kennebago stream, nor from the foot of 10 the Boulders, so called, in said stream to the head of the

11 falls at the outlet of Kennebago lake, at any time; nor
12 in Metalluc brook which flows into the upper Richardson
13 lake, or in the tributaries of said brook, at any time.
14 Provided, that the above provisions shall not apply to
15 that portion of the stream connecting Long pond and
16 Rangeley lake, which is below the old pine stump stand17 ing above the bridge on said stream.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions 2 of this act shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten dollars for 3 the attempt, and one dollar for each and every trout or 4 land-locked salmon so taken, caught, killed or destroyed, 5 to be recovered by complaint before any trial justice, one-6 half to the complainant, and one-half to the county where 7 the complaint is made.
