## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to extend the time for the location and construction of the Wiscasset and Quebec Railroad, the Messalonskee and Kennebec Railroad and the Somerset Railroad.

B: it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The act entitled "An Act to amend and

- 2 extend the acts in relation to the Wiscasset and Quebec
- 3 Railroad Company, the Messalonskee and Kennebec Rail-
- 4 road Company, and the Somerset Railroad Company,"
- 5 approved the ninth day of February in the year eighteen
- 6 hundred and seventy-eight, is hereby extended and con-
- 7 tinued in force, and the further time of eight years from

- 8 the approval of this act is allowed to each and all of said
- 9 companies to locate and construct the railroads established
- 10 by their charters and acts additional thereto, according to
- 11 the several charters of said companies, and acts additional
- 12 thereto and amendatory thereof and to exercise all the
- 13 rights and powers granted thereby.
  - SECT. 2. Section fifteen of chapter three hundred and
- 2 fifty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hun-
- 3 dred and fifty-four, entitled "An Act to establish the
- 4 Kennebec and Wiscasset Railroad Company" is hereby
- 5 amended by striking out all of said section after the word
- 6 "home" in the sixth line thereof.
  - SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
