STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Education of the Youth in the Township of Moxie Gore, No. 1, R. 5, E. K. R., Somerset County.

Resolved, That the interest on the money now in the 2 state treasury belonging to the township of Moxie Gore, 3 No. 1, R. 5, E. K. R., Somerset county, for school pur-4 poses, and such part of the principal as the state superin-5 tendent of common schools shall deem right and proper, 6 shall be annually appropriated for the education of the 7 youth in said township; but the sum shall be expended 8 under the direction of the said superintendent. • •

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Moxie Gore is an unimportant township of such character and so located that it will probably never become incorporated as a plantation or town. It now contains one family in which there are ten children of school age. This family lives five miles from any school, and could reach that school only over a wood road impassable to carriages.

In the State treasury there is now a school fund, to the credit of this township, the interest on which will be about twenty dollars per annum. It would seem good policy that the income of this fund, at least, should be utilized for the education of these children. The parents are willing to furnish a suitable room and to board a teacher. It is therefore recommended that this resolve be passed.
