## STATE OF MAINE.

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

**PAN** ACT to amend the charter of the City of Augusta.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter two hundred and twenty-four of 2 the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and 3 forty-nine is hereby amended by inserting at the end of 4 section sixth of said chapter the following words:

'The collector of taxes may appoint, by and with the 6 consent of the mayor and board of aldermen, one or 7 more deputy collectors of taxes for said city, who shall 8 hold office during the term for which the collector of 9 taxes was elected. Such deputy collectors shall, under 10 the direction of said collector, render assistance to said 11 collector in the collection of taxes committed to said col-

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lector, and for that purpose shall have the same power 12 that said collector has, and shall receive the same fees 13 that a sheriff or constable would be entitled to for like 14 services, to be added to such tax and collected of the 15 delinquent. The verbal instructions of said collector to 16 such deputy collector shall be sufficient to authorize all 17 lawful acts of such deputy collector performed in the 18 discharge of the duties of his office, and such instructions 19 20 need not be set forth in his return. The return of the doings 21 ngs of such deputy collector shall be in the same form : s 22 that required of said collector but shall be certified by Such deputy collectors shall from 23 said deputy collector. 24 time to time as required account for and pay over to said - 25 collector the amount of all taxes and interest thereon col--26 lected by them.' So that said section as amended shall -27 read as follows:

Section 6. City assessors shall be annually appointed 29 by the city council, who shall exercise and be subject to 30, the same powers, duties and liabilities that the assessors in 31, the several towns in this State, may exercise and be subject to under existing laws; provided, however, that the city 32 33 council may appoint one person in each ward, whose duty it shall be to furnish the assessors with all necessary infor-34 35 mation relative to persons and property taxable in his ward, and who shall be sworn to the faithful performance of 36 .37 his duty. All taxes shall be assessed, apportioned and collected in the manner prescribed by the laws of this **3**8 39 State relative to town taxes: provided, however, that it 40 shall be lawful for the city council to establish further41 and additional provisions for the collection thereof.

'The collector of taxes may appoint, by and with the 43 consent of the mayor and board of aldermen, one or more 44 deputy collectors of taxes for said city, who shall hold 45 office during the term for which the collector of taxes 46 was elected. Such deputy collectors shall, under the 47 direction of said collector, render assistance to said collector, and for that purpose shall have the same power **48** 49 that said collector has, and shall receive the same fees that a sheriff or constable would be entitled to for like 50 services, to be added to such tax and collected of the 51 The verbal instructions of said collector to 52delinguent. such deputy collector shall be sufficient to authorize all 53 54lawful acts of such deputy collector performed in the discharge of the duties of his office, and such instructions 5556need not be set forth in his return. The return of the doings of such deputy collector shall be in the same form 57 as that required of said collector, but shall be certified 58by said deputy collector. Such deputy collectors shall 59 60 from time to time as required account for and pay over 61 to said collector the amount of all taxes and interest 62 thereon collected by them.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
