STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT additional to Chapter twenty-four of the Revised
Statutes, relating to Paupers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. When a person who has not acquired a
2 pauper settlement in any town or city in the State is
3 found in any incorporated place, needing immediate relief,
4 such relief shall be furnished by the overseers of the poor
5 of such place and the city or town so furnishing relief
6 shall be reimbursed by the State to such an amount as
7 the Governor and Council shall adjudge to have been
8 necessarily expended therefor. *Provided, however, that*

9 the aforesaid overseers of the poor shall give notice by
10 mail to the Governor and Council so soon as may be after
11 such person shall have been found in such town, giving
12 all the information they may be able to obtain, and they
13 shall follow the direction of the Governor and Council
14 thereafter in furnishing such relief or in any matter per-
15 taining to such case.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
