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## STATE OF MAINE.

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RESOLVE in favor of Saint Elizabeth Roman Catholic  
Orphan Asylum in Portland.

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*Resolved,* That the sum of eight hundred dollars be and is  
2 hereby appropriated for the use of Saint Elizabeth Roman  
3 Catholic Orphan Asylum in Portland, of which four hun-  
4 dred dollars shall be paid during the year eighteen hundred  
5 and ninety-three, and four hundred dollars during the year  
6 eighteen hundred and ninety-four.



## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

*To the Honorable the Senate and House of Representatives of  
the State of Maine:*

In asking the annual aid for St. Elizabeth's Roman Catholic Orphan Asylum, situated in Portland but receiving children from any part of Maine, we beg leave to state that the number of children under our care in December, 1892, was forty-two. We desire to inform the honorable members of the legislature that the Sisters of Mercy, conspicuous as nurses in military hospitals during the late war, are in charge of the asylum; that the institution is open to visitors on any day of the year, and that in this house, as in all Catholic houses of education or of charity, there is no exclusion on account of not being a Catholic.
