STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Normal and the Madawaska Training Schools of Maine.

Resolved, That the board of trustees of the Normal and
2 Madawaska Training schools be authorized to effect a
3 reasonable insurance on the interest of the State in the
4 buildings and other property in said schools and that for
5 this purpose the sum of one thousand dollars or such part
6 thereof as is necessary be and hereby is appropriated.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The trustees of the normal schools of this State feeling a great responsibility regarding the safety of those buildings, especially after the great fire at Farmington, recommend to the legislature that an fire insurance policy be obtained on each of the buildings and contents in their several locations.

The Committee on Education in looking into the matter find that in case any of the buildings should be destroyed between the sessions of the legislature, a long time would elapse before the schools could be restored to their efficiency, and that particular branch of education would greatly suffer. They unanimously recommend the passage of the resolve, as the expense would be trifling in comparison with the loss of any one of the schools would entail.
