RESOLVE in favor of Castine State Normal School.

Resolved, That for the purpose of providing suitable
2 water closets and sewerage for the Castine State Normal
3 School, there be and hereby is appropriated for the year
4 1893, the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Instead of water-closets, the Castine Normal School is provided with dry-earth closets situated in the basement.

Of this arrangement and the resulting conditions, the secretary of the State Board of Health says: "I am very sure that I am voicing the opinion of the board in characterizing such conditions as an outrage upon the students and unworthy of our State."

It is now proposed to put in a system of water-closets for the expense of which the following estimates have been made:

Piping for sewerage,	\$600 00
Digging " "	375 00
Closets,	400 00
Tank,	75 00
Force pump,	50 00
