STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of a road in Dallas Plantation.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars, to be expended 3 under the direction of the county commissioners of Flank-4 lin county, in building a road in Dallas Plantation, 5 between Rangeley and Dead River station. •

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This road was recently located by the county commissioners of Franklin county on a petition signed by the inhabitants of Rangeley, Coplin and Eustis, it is about four (4) miles long and connects the Rangeley and Dead River settlements.

About eight (8) miles of road extending from Dead River station down Dead river south branch to Coplin was built last year entirely by private subscription and this piece of road if built will complete the connection between these growing settlements, and stimulate the development and prosperity of both, and encourage settlers along the valley of Dead River. This particular part of the road, between these towns, is expensive to build and the territory over which it is located is burnt land and nearly worthless, and the tax assessed upon it by the county commissioners is as much as it ought to bear and is not sufficient to complete the road, and it cannot be done unless aid is granted by the State.
