STATE OF MAINE.

EN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Section thirty-one of Chapter twenty-seven of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter one hundred and forty of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, and Chapter one hundred and thirty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section thirty-one of chapter twenty-seven of the Revised

- 2 Statutes as amended by chapter one hundred and forty of
- 3 the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven,
- 4 and chapter one hundred and thirty-two of the Public
- 5 Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one is hereby
- 6 amended so that said section, as amended, shall read as
- 7 follows:

Section 31. No person shall knowingly bring into the State or knowingly transport from place to place in the State, any intoxicating liquors, with intent to sell the same in the State in violation of law, or with intent that the same shall be so sold by any person, or to aid any person in such sale, under a penalty of not more than Any servant, agent or employe of any 14 fifty dollars. railroad corporation, or of any express company doing business in this State, who shall remove any intoxicating 17 liquors from any railroad car at any place other than the usual and established stations, depots or places of business of such railroad corporation, or who shall aid in or 19 consent to such removal, shall be subject to a penalty of 20 not exceeding fifty dollars for every such offence; provided, that said penalty shall not apply to any liquor in 22 transit when changed from car to car to facilitate trans-24 portation. All such liquors intended for unlawful sale in the State, may be seized while in transit and proceeded against the same as if they were unlawfully kept and 26 deposited in any place. And any steamboat, railroad or 27 28 express company knowingly transporting or bringing such liquors into the State shall be punished, upon con-29 viction, by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars for Knowledge on the part of any authorized each offence. agent of such company shall be deemed knowledge of the 33 corporation.
