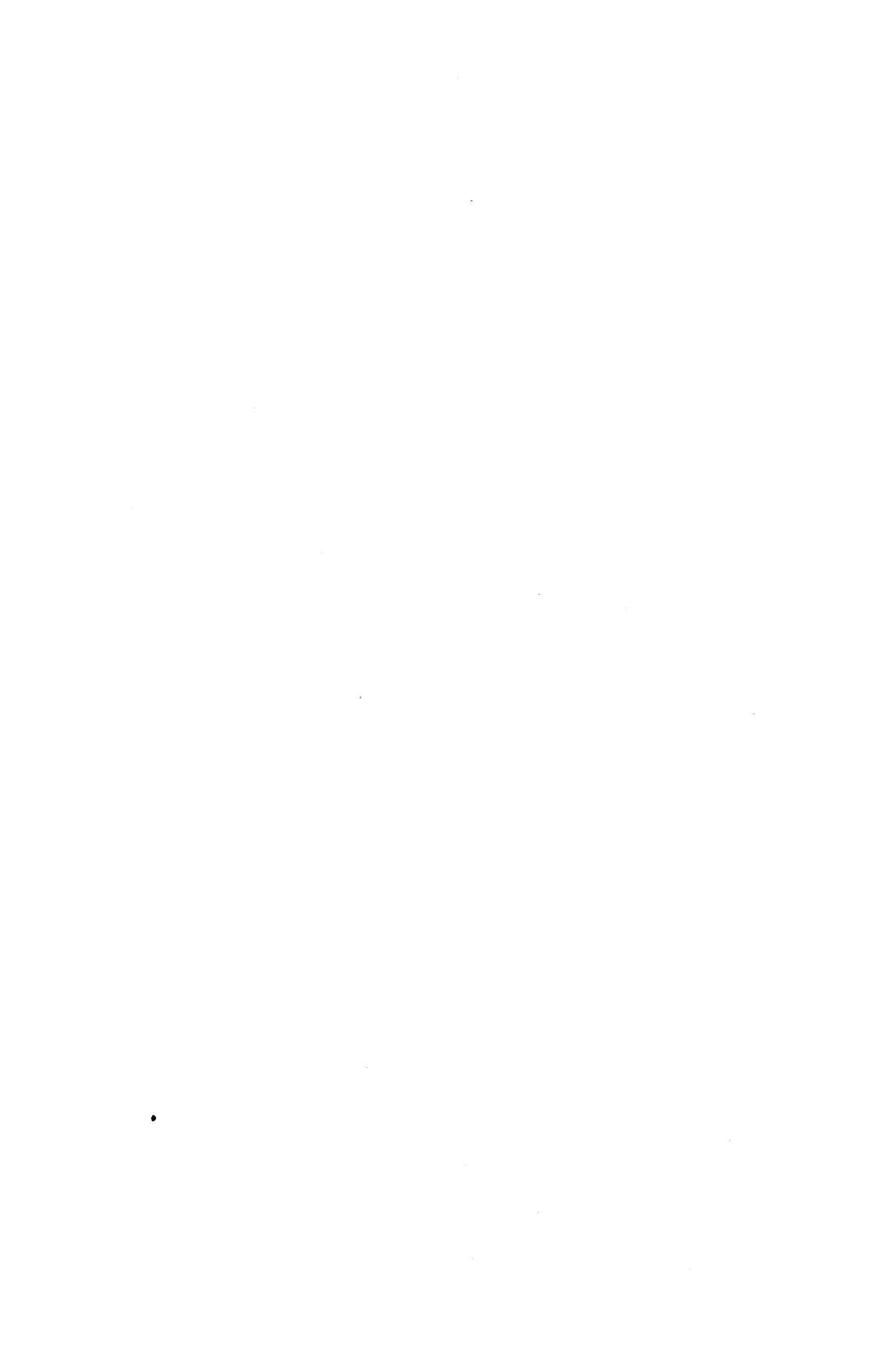
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Section thirty-one of Chapter twenty-seven of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter one hundred and forty of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, and Chapter one hundred and thirty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section thirty-one of chapter twenty-seven of the Revised
2 Statutes as amended by chapter one hundred and forty of
3 the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven,
4 and chapter one hundred and thirty-two of the Public
5 Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one is hereby
6 amended so that said section, as amended, shall read as
7 follows:

‘Section 31. No person shall knowingly bring into the
9 State or knowingly transport from place to place in the
10 State, any intoxicating liquors, with intent to sell the
11 same in the State in violation of law, or with intent that
12 the same shall be so sold by any person, or to aid any
13 person in such sale, under a penalty of not more than
14 fifty dollars. Any servant, agent or employe of any
15 railroad corporation, or of any express company doing
16 business in this State, who shall remove any intoxicating
17 liquors from any railroad car at any place other than the
18 usual and established stations, depots or places of busi-
19 ness of such railroad corporation, or who shall aid in or
20 consent to such removal, shall be subject to a penalty of
21 not exceeding fifty dollars for every such offence; pro-
22 vided, that said penalty shall not apply to any liquor in
23 transit when changed from car to car to facilitate trans-
24 portation. All such liquors intended for unlawful sale
25 in the State, may be seized while in transit and proceeded
26 against the same as if they were unlawfully kept and
27 deposited in any place. And any steamboat, railroad or
28 express company knowingly transporting or bringing
29 such liquors into the State shall be punished, upon con-
30 viction, by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars for
31 each offence. Knowledge on the part of any authorized
32 agent of such company shall be deemed knowledge of the
33 corporation.’
