## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT amendatory of Section 21, Chapter 102 of the Public Laws of 1891.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Amend section 21, chapter 102, of the Public Laws of

- 2 1891, as follows: Insert in line twenty-one thereof after
- 3 the word "authority" the following: 'shall be present at
- 4 and witness the counting by the presiding officer or offic-
- 5 ers of all votes cast in such meetings,' so that said section
- 6 shall read as follows:

'Section 21. The municipal officers of cities, towns and

- 8 plantations voting in accordance with the provisions of
- 9 this act, shall biennially in the month of May appoint
- 10 clerks for each polling place. For each polling place

11 in cities and towns of more than one thousand in-12 habitants four clerks, and for each polling place in plantations, and for each island ward of the city of Portland and for the island district of the town of Cumberland, and for every town of less than 1,000 inhabitants two clerks shall be appointed. Said clerks shall equally represent each of the political parties which cast the largest number of votes in the State elec-19 tion next preceding their appointment. Each of said offi-20 cers shall be sworn to the faithful performance of his duties, and shall hold office for two years from the date of his appointment, and until a successor is appointed and qualified, or he is removed. Such election officers shall attend at the times and places designated for meetings in their respective wards, towns or plantations for the election of any national, state, county or ward officers, and for the determination of any question submitted to the qualified voters of any city by lawful authority, shall be present at and witness the counting by the presiding officer or officers of all votes cast at such meetings, and shall receive such reasonable compensation for each day's actual service as the municipal officers of their respective cities, towns and plantations may determine. No person shall 34 be eligible to the position of election officer in any ward, town or plantation where he is a candidate to be voted 36 for.'
