STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT relating to the Protection of Fish in Cobscook or Orange River.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. The entire control and authority over the
- 2 fishways and the right and privilege of taking salmon,
- 3 shad and alewives in the Orange river, within the limits of
- 4 the town of Whiting, in the county of Washington, is here-
- 5 by granted to said town of Whiting; but nothing contained
- 6 in this act is intended to be in conflict with the fortieth
- 7 chapter of the Revised Statutes and its amendments.
 - SECT. 2. Said town, at any legal town meeting, when
- 2 an article shall be duly inserted in the warrant for that
- 3 purpose, is hereby authorized and empowered to take all
- 4 such action as may be necessary to cause proper fishways

- 5 to be opened, constructed and maintained through the
- 6 dams on said river, within the limits of said town, and
- 7 for that purpose may choose committees or authorize the
- 8 selectmen to cause it to be done, who may act for them-
- 9 selves, or appoint a committee or committees for that
- 10 purpose. And said town may raise the necessary amount
- 11 of money to cause said fishways to be built and main-
- 12 tained, instead of requiring the owners of the dams to do
- 13 it, as they think best.
 - SECT. 3. The said selectmen or committees in dis-
- 2 charge of their duties under this act, are authorized and
- 3 empowered to pass over the land of any proprietor on said
- 4 river, or through any mills or buildings so far as it may be
- 5 necessary to the proper discharge of their duties, and the
- 6 damages, if any, arising from the exercise of such authority
- 7 shall be assessed by the county commissioners of Washing-
- 8 ton county.
- SECT. 4. It shall not be lawful for any person to take
- 2 any salmon, shad or alewives in said river without per-
- 3 mission of said town, within two years from the time this
- 4 act shall take effect, and any person so offending shall on
- 5 conviction be punished by a fine of ten dollars for each of-
- 6 fense, one-half to the complainant and the other half to
- 7 said town.
- SECT. 5. It shall and may be lawful for said town in-
- 2 stead of appointing a committee as aforesaid, to contract
- 3 with some suitable person or persons, upon proper terms
- 4 and conditions, to cause the said fishways to be built and

- 5 maintained, who shall have the same rights, authority and
- 6 protection as such selectmen or committee would have.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.
