# STATE OF MAINE.

(N THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT amendatory of Section 21, Chapter 102 of the Public Laws of 1891.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Amend section 21, chapter 102, of the Pub-2 lic Laws of 1891, as follows: Insert in line twenty-one 3 thereof after the word "authority" the following: 'shall 4 be present at and witness the counting by the presiding 5 officer or officers of all votes cast in such meetings,' so 6 that said section shall read as follows:

Section 21. The municipal officers of cities, towns and
8 plantations voting in accordance with the provisions of
9 this act, shall biennially in the month of May appoint
10 clerksfor each polling place. For each polling place

in cities and towns of more than one thousand in-11 12 habitants four clerks, and for each polling place in 13plantations, and for each island ward of the city of 14 Portland and for the island district of the town of 15Cumberland, and for every town of less than 1,000 in-16 habitants two clerks shall be appointed. Said clerks 17 shall equally represent each of the political parties which cast the largest number of votes in the State elec-18 tion next preceding their appointment. Each of said offi-19  $\mathbf{20}$ cers shall be sworn to the faithful performance of his duties, and shall hold office for two years from the date of 21 his appointment, and until a successor is appointed and 22qualified, or he is removed. Such election officers shall  $\mathbf{23}$  $\mathbf{24}$ attend at the times and places designated for meetings in 2.5their respective wards, towns or plantations for the elec- $\mathbf{26}$ tion of any national, state, county or ward officers, and for the determination of any question submitted to the 27 $\mathbf{28}$ qualified voters of any city by lawful authority, shall be present at and witness the counting by the presiding offi-29 30cer or officers of all votes cast at such meetings, and shall receive such reasonable compensation for each day's actual 31 service as the municipal officers of their respective cities, 32 33towns and plantations may determine. No person shall  $\mathbf{34}$ be eligible to the position of election officer in any ward, 35town or plantation where he is a candidate to be voted 36 for.'

### AMENDMENT TO HOUSE DOCUMENT No. 205.

I move to amend by adding after the words "to be voted for" in the thirty-fifth and thirty-sixth lines the following:

'Two of the clerks in each polling place, one from each political party, shall be detailed by the municipal officers to act as ballot clerks. The two ballot clerks thus detailed and appointed in each polling place shall have the charge of the ballots therein, and shall furnish them to the voters in the manner hereinafter set forth.

A duplicate list of the qualified voters in each ward, town or plantation shall be prepared for the use of the ballot clerks, and all the provisions of law relative to the preparation, furnishing and preservation of check lists shall apply to such duplicate lists.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
