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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED  
AND NINETY-THREE.

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AN ACT to amend Chapter 511 Private and Special Laws  
entitled “An Act to incorporate the Mechanic Falls Water  
and Electric Light and Power Company.”

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 4 of said act is hereby amended by  
2 inserting in the fifth line thereof after the word “Oxford,”  
3 the words ‘or Hebron,’ so that said section as amended  
4 shall read as follows:

‘Section 4. Said corporation is hereby authorized for  
6 the purposes aforesaid, to take, detain and use the water  
7 of the Little Androscoggin river or any other suitable  
8 source of water supply in said Minot or Poland or the

9 town of Oxford or Hebron in Oxford county, and to erect  
10 and maintain reservoirs and dams and lay down and main-  
11 tain pipes and aqueducts necessary for the proper accumu-  
12 lating, conducting, discharging, distributing and disposing  
13 of water and forming proper reservoirs thereof; and said  
14 corporation may take and hold by purchase or otherwise  
15 any lands, or real estate necessary therefor and may  
16 excavate through any lands when necessary for the pur-  
17 poses of this incorporation.'

SECT. 2. Section 13, of said act is hereby amended by  
2 striking out in the second line thereof the word "four" and  
3 inserting in place thereof the word 'eight' so that said sec-  
4 tion as amended shall read as follows :

'Section 13. In case the works of this corporation have  
6 not been put in operation within eight years from the date  
7 of the approval of this act the rights and privileges herein  
8 granted shall be null and void.'

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
