## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to further amend Section nine of Chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes, relating to Burying Grounds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section nine of chapter fifteen of the Re-

- 2 vised Statutes, as amended by chapter forty-seven of the
- 3 Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, is here-
- 4 by further amended by adding to said section as amended
- 5 the following words: 'nor the extension thereof away
- 6 from any dwelling house,' so that said section shall read
- 7 as follows:

'Sect. 9. The municipal officers of any town, may

- 9 on petition of ten voters, enlarge any public ceme-
- 10 tery or burying yard or incorporated cemetery or bury-

11 ing yard within their town, by taking land of adjacent 12 owners, to be paid for by the town or otherwise as the 13 municipal officers may direct, when in their judgment 14 public necessity requires it, provided, that the limits 15 thereof shall not be extended nearer any dwelling house 16 than twenty-five rods, agasnst the written protest of the 17 owner, made to said officers at the time of the hearing 18 on said petition. Nor shall any person, corporation or 19 association establish, locate or enlarge any cemetery or 20 burying ground by selling or otherwise disposing of lots 21 so that the limits thereof shall be extended nearer any dwelling house than twenty-five rods against the written 23 protest of the owner, provided, that nothing in this sec-24 tion shall prohibit the sale or disposition of lots within 25 the limits of any existing cemetery or burying ground, 26] nor the extension thereof away from any dwelling house.' SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
