## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to incorporate the Wilson Stream Dam Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Samuel Sterns, E. T. Spencer, Charles W.

- 2 Coffin, N. M. Jones, their associates and assigns, be, and
- 3 they are hereby created a body politic and corporate by
- 4 the name of the Wilson Stream Dam Company, with all
- 5 the powers, rights and privileges of similar corporations.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may erect and maintain a

- 2 dam or dams, with side booms and sluices, on Wilson
- 3 stream, flowing into Sebec lake, in Piscataquis county,
- 4 to facilitate the driving of logs and lumber down said
- 5 stream; and said corporation may remove rocks, excavate

6 ledges, build dams and side dams, and make other improvements for said purpose except that it shall not blast out or excavate at Upper and Lower Greeley Falls, 9 and may take land and materials for building said dams 10 and making said improvements, and flow contiguous 11 lands so far as necessary to raise suitable heads of water. 12 And if the parties owning said lands and materials, can-13 not agree upon the damages therefor, then said damages 14 shall be estimated by the county commissioners for the 15 County of Piscataquis, as provided by law in case of 16 taking lands for public highways; and for the damage 17 occasioned by flowing land, the said corporation shall not 18 be liable to an action at common law, but the person injured may have a remedy, by complaint for flowing, in the manner provided by chapter ninety-two of the 21 Revised Statutes.

Sect. 3. The said corporation may demand and receive 2 a toll for the passage of logs cut and hauled above the 3 present south line of the town of Greenville over their 4 said dams and improvements, of thirty cents, for each 5 thousand feet, board measure, woods scale, and fifteen 6 cents for each thousand feet as aforesaid of pulp wood 7 and logs intended for pulp wood, and said corporation 8 shall have a lien upon all logs which may pass over any 9 of its dams and improvements for the payment of said 10 tolls, but the logs of each particular mark shall be holden 11 only for the tolls of such mark, and unless such toll is 12 paid within twenty days after such logs, or a major part

- 13 of them, shall arrive at the Penobscot boom, or place of
- 14 manufacture, said corporation may seize said logs and
- 15 sell at public so many thereof as shall be necessary to
- 16 pay such toll and costs and charges, notice of the time
- 17 and place of such sale, ten days before such sale, being
- 18 first given in some newspaper printed at Bangor and
- 19 Dover, and when said corporation shall from tolls be
- 20 reimbursed for its expenditures, and eight per cent
- 21 interest thereon, the tolls shall cease.
  - SECT. 4. Said corporation shall not hold back and
- 2 retain any of the water of said Wilson stream, except
- 3 during such times as may be necessary for driving logs
- 4 and lumber as provided for in this act.
  - SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
