STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Section 41, Chapter 40 of the Revised Statutes, relating to the protection of Salmon, Shad and other migratory fish at certain points on Penobscot and Kennebec Rivers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 41 of chapter 40 of the Revised Statutes, as

- 2 amended by chapter 66, Public Laws of 1887, and former-
- 3 amendments is hereby amended by inserting after the
- 4 word "State," in the seventeenth line of said section as
- 5 heretofore amended, the following words, 'Nor shall it
- 6 apply to the taking of alewives by the town of Woolwich
- 7 in the Nequassett stream; so that said section including
- 8 all amendments shall read as follows: 'No salmon, shad

9 or other migratory fish shall be taken or fished for within 10 five hundred yards of any fish-way, dam or mill-race; nor 11 in the Penobscot river between the mouth of the Kendus-12 keag stream and the water works dam at Treat's falls, on 13 said river; nor between the Augusta highway bridge, 14 over the Kennebec river, and the Augusta dam, between the first days of April and November, except by the ordinary mode of angling with single hook and line, or artificial flies; nor shall hook and line or artificial flies be used at any time within one hundred yards of any fishway, dam or mill-race; but this section shall not apply 20 to the taking of alewives by the town of Warren in the 21 Georges river, and by the town of Waldoboro in the Medomak river, under the authority granted said towns by the private and special laws of Massachusetts, passed March six, eighteen hundred and two, and amendments thereto passed by the legislature of this State; nor shall it apply to the taking of alewives by the town of Woolwich in Nequassett stream. The penalty for 28 violation of this section is a fine of not more than fifty nor less than ten dollars for each offence and a further 30 fine of ten dollars for each salmon and one dollar for each 31 shad so taken.'
