STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Section 31 of Chapter 40 of the Revised Statutes relating to Inland Fisheries as amended by Chapter 266 of the Laws of 1885. Chapter 77 of the Laws of 1887, Chapter 209 of the Laws of 1889, Chapter 27 of the Laws of 1891, and Chapter 80 of the Laws of 1891.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section thirty-one of chapter forty of the Revised Stat-2 utes as amended by chapter two hundred and sixty-six of 3 the laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, chapter sev-4 enty-seven of the laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-5 seven, chapter two hundred and nine of the laws of eigh-6 teen hundred and eighty-nine, chapter twenty-seven of 7 the laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, and chapter

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8 eighty of the laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, is
9 hereby amended by restoring in the tenth line the words
10 'Eastern Penobscot river in Orland,' so that said section as
11 amended shall read as follows :

The following waters and their tributaries Section 31. 13 are exempt from the provisions relating to migratory fishes and the supervision of the fishways by the commis-14 15sioners, that is to say, Royalls river in North Yarmouth, Sewalls pond or its outlet in Arrowsic, so much of the 16 17 waters of the Damariscotta river as are west of the railroad bridge near Damariscotta Mills, all waters Vinal-18 19 haven, Bluehill, Tremont, Mount Desert, Eden, Franklin and Sullivan, Tunk river in Steuben, Pleasant river in 20 21 Washington county, the East Machias river and the Eastern Penobscot river in Orland.' 22
