AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter one hundred and  
thirty-five of the Revised Statutes, in relation to Sentence  
and Execution.


*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter one hundred and  
2 thirty-five of the Revised Statutes, is hereby amended by  
3 inserting after the words "imprisonment or fine," in the  
4 sixth line of said section, the words, 'or by fine and in  
5 addition thereto imprisonment,' so that said section shall  
6 read as follows :

'Section 1. No person shall be punished for an offence  
8 until convicted thereof in a court having jurisdiction of  
9 the person and case. When no punishment is provided

10 by statute, a person convicted of an offence shall be im-  
11 prisoned for less than one year or fined not exceeding  
12 five hundred dollars. When it is provided that he shall  
13 be punished by imprisonment and fine, or by imprison-  
14 ment or fine, or by fine and in addition thereto imprison-  
15 ment, he may be sentenced to either or both. In all  
16 cases where a fine is imposed he may be sentenced to  
17 pay the costs of prosecution; and for violations of sec-  
18 tions thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-seven, forty and forty-  
19 five of chapter twenty-seven, he shall be sentenced to  
20 pay such costs.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
