RESOLVE in favor of James L. Holden.

Resolved, That hereafter there be paid out of the State
2 treasury to James L. Holden of Oxford, a pension of six
3 dollars per month.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

OXFORD, Maine, January 14, 1893.

To the Chairman Ucommittee of Pensions.

DEAR SIR: Allow me to call your attention to the case of James S. Holden a pensioner of the State who is drawing the very small sum of \$2.00 per month for an injury received while in the service of the State as set forth in his application now on file at Augusta. I have no doubt Mr. Holden is deserving of more State aid as he becomes more and more infirm, (from the causes set forth in his application,) with advancing years.

He has great difficulty about sleeping from the pains in his back when assuming the recumbant position.

I gave affidavit in relation to the manner of injury with subsequent results which are doubtless on file at the office of the Adjutant General.
