RESOLVE in favor of Nancy T. Libby.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the State treasury,

- 2 to Nancy T. Libby of Winthrop, a pension of six dollars
- 3 per month, beginning January one, eighteen and ninety-
- 4 three.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine.

Your petitioner would respectfully represent that she is a native of the town of Winthrop, Maine, and has been a resident thereof nearly all her life, that her age is sixty-two years and that she is the widow of Charles S. Libby who was a private in Co. B. Sixty-fourth Reg. N. Y. Vol. Infantry who also was a resident of the state the greater part of his life both before and after his service in the army and was also a native of this State, that she is in receipt of a pension from the U. S. Government of eight dollars per month under the dependent pension act, that she has no other means of support aside from said pension than her own labor, that owing to impaired health the amount she is able to earn by her labor together with said pension is wholly inadequate to furnish her comfortable support and will be still more so as years and impairment of health increase.

Wherefore she prays that an act may be passed granting to her from the State a pension sufficient in addition to that she is now receiving from government to furnish her an adequate and comfortable support.
