STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Section three of Chapter twenty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred eighty-seven, relating to Schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section three of chapter twenty-two of the

- 2 Public Laws of eighteen hundred eighty-seven, is hereby
- 3 amended by inserting after the word "therefor" in the
- 4 fourth line, the words and shall promptly report the
- 5 same to the superintending school committee,' and by
- 6 adding to said section the following and said officers
- 7 shall have power, and it shall be their duty when notified

- 8 by any teacher, that any pupil is irregular in attendance,
- 9 to arrest and take such pupil to school when found truant;
- 10 and it shall be the duty of such officers to enforce the
- 11 provisions of one hundred and fourteen to one hundred
- 12 and sixteen, inclusive, of chapter eleven of the Revised
- 13 Statutes,' so that said section shall read as follows:

'Section 3. Cities and towns shall annually elected one 15 or more persons, to be designated truant officers, who shall inquire into all cases of neglect of the duty prescribed in section one and ascertain the reasons therefor, 18 and shall promptly report the same to the superintending school committee, and such truant officers, or any one of 19 20 them, shall, when so directed by the school committee or supervisor in writing, prosecute in the name of the city or town, any person liable to the penalty provided in said section; and said officers shall have power, and it shall be their duty, when notified by any teacher, that any pupil is irregular in attendance, to arrest and take such pupil to school when found truant; and further it shall be 26 the duty of such officers to enforce the provisions of sections one hundred fourteen to one hundred sixteen inclu-29 sive, of chapter eleven of the Revised Statutes.'

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent here-2 with are hereby repealed.
