STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriation for the Passamaquoddy
Tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the State treasury,
2 to be expended under the direction of the governor and
3 council, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of
4 Indians, for the benefit of said tribe, for the years eighteen
5 hundred and ninety-three and eighteen hundred and ninety-
6 four, as follows : For May dividend, five hundred dollars
7 each year ; for November dividend, five hundred dollars
8 each year ; for distressed and contingent poor, three
9 thousand and five hundred dollars each year ; for contin-
10 gent purposes, one hundred and fifty dollars each year ;
11 for bounty on crops, two hundred dollars each year ; for
12 ploughing, one hundred and fifty dollars each year ; for
13 salaries of governors, one hundred dollars each year ; for

14 salary of lieutenant governor, forty dollars each year ;
15 for wood, five hundred dollars each year ; for dressing
16 for land, one hundred and fifty dollars each year ; for
17 educational purposes, six hundred dollars each year ; for
18 salary of priests, two hundred dollars each year ; for
19 salary of agent, two hundred dollars each year ; for basket
20 ash, one hundred dollars each year ; for agricultural pur-
21 poses, six hundred dollars each year ; for repair of hall
22 at Pleasant Point, one hundred and fifty dollars ; for
23 repairs of school-room at Pleasant Point, twenty-five dol-
24 lars ; for repairs of church at Peter Dana's point, one
25 hundred dollars ; for stove and pipe for church at Pleasant
26 Point, twenty-two dollars ; for school books, fifty dollars ;
27 for police at Pleasant Point, twenty dollars ; the last six
28 items of this resolve are appropriated for the year
29 eighteen hundred and ninety-three only, and to be ex-
30 pended under the direction of the agent of said tribe.
31 All the foregoing sums to be expended under the direction
32 of the governor and council, for the purposes for which
33 they are appropriated, and for none other ; and any sum
34 of money not expended for the purpose for which it is
35 appropriated, shall not be allowed to said agent in the
36 settlement of his accounts.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled :

The Indians through our representative respectfully present the following as items for the consideration of the legislature :

First : The present appropriation of \$3,500 for distressed poor, is too small, and therefore should be increased from five to eight hundred dollars. We also ask for repairs of school room at Pleasant Point (\$25) twenty-five dollars, and for repair of hall at same place, one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150). For repair of church at Peter Dana's point, two hundred dollars (\$200) ; building and repairs on road, Peter Dana's Point, \$200, one hundred each year ($2\frac{1}{4}$ miles) ; digging and stoning well at Peter Dana's Point, \$22 ; twenty-two dollars for stove for church at Pleasant Point ; school books, both schools, fifty dollars (\$50) ; for salary police at Pleasant Point, twenty dollars ; for police at Peter Dana's Point, twenty dollars. For two U. S. flags, twenty-five dollars (\$25). Referring to police : At either village a police is necessary, as people come from the villages drunk and with liquor and should at once be arrested.

All of which is respectfully submitted.
