STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Section seventy of chapter fifty-one of
the Revised Statutes, relating to provisions for Safety on
Railroads.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows.*

Section seventy of chapter fifty-one of the Revised
2 Statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto the follow-
3 ing: 'And whoever, without right, enters upon any
4 railroad track with any team, or any vehicle however
5 propelled, or drives any team or propels any vehicle upon
6 any railroad track, shall be punished by fine not less
7 than fifty dollars or by imprisonment not less than thirty
8 days.' So that said section as amended shall read as
9 follows:

‘Section 70. Whoever without right, stands or walks
11 on a railroad track or bridge, or passes such bridge except
12 by railroad conveyance, forfeits not less than five nor
13 more than twenty dollars, to be recovered by complaint ;
14 and whoever, without right, enters upon any railroad
15 track with any team, or any vehicle however propelled,
16 or drives any team or propels any vehicle upon any rail-
17 road track, shall be punished by fine not less than fifty
18 dollars or by imprisonment not less than thirty days.’
