STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to regulate the method of obtaining private and
special legislation for fish and game.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Whoever petitions the legislature, or who-
2 ever shall introduce any bill, act, or resolve for private
3 and special legislation regarding or in any manner per-
4 taining to fish or game, shall first have given notice of
5 their intention with full description of the territory or
6 waters effected by such legislation, in some weekly pub-
7 lication nearest the locality so effected, for eight consec-
8 utive weeks, the last notice to be not less than one, nor
9 more than three weeks before the assembling of the legis-
10 lature, of which such legislation is required, and such

11 notice shall be absolutely required before any such legis-
12 lation shall be enacted.

Provided, however, that the provisions of this act shall
14 not apply to any petition, act or resolve either repealing
15 or amendatory which has for its object the placing of the
16 territory or waters in question under the general laws of
17 the State.

SECT. 2. All laws hereafter enacted pertaining to fish
2 or game which do not conform to the general laws of the
3 State, shall for the purposes of this act be deemed private
4 and special.
