STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Chapter two hundred and seventy-three
of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five,
entitled “An act to provide for the holding of County
Teachers’ Conventions.”

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and
2 seventy-three of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred
3 and eighty-five is hereby amended by substituting for the
4 words “six hundred” in the eleventh line thereof, the
5 words ‘one thousand,’ so that said section as amended
6 shall read as follows:

‘Section 1. Whenever not less than thirty of the
8 teachers and school officers of any county shall have

9 formed an association under rules of government approved
10 by the State superintendent of common schools, for the
11 purpose of mutual improvement in the science and art of
12 teaching, and of creating popular interest in, and diffus-
13 ing a knowledge of the best methods of improving our
14 public school system, by the holding of conventions at
15 least once every year under the supervision of the State
16 superintendent, the State shall defray the necessary
17 expenses attending the holding such conventions, for
18 which purpose the sum of one thousand dollars is hereby
19 annually appropriated, to be deducted and set aside
20 therefor by the treasurer of State from the annual school
21 fund of the State; *provided, however,* that no more than
22 two such associations shall be formed in any county, and
23 that the expenses as aforesaid of no more than two con-
24 ventions of any such association in any year shall be
25 defrayed by the State.'

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent here-
2 with are hereby repealed.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on approval.
