STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Chapter twenty-three of the Public
Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven relating to the
unlawful using or wearing the badge of the Grand Army
of the Republic of this State.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Chapter twenty-three of the Public Laws of eighteen
2 hundred and eighty-seven is hereby amended by insert-
3 ing after the word "Republic" in the second line thereof,
4 the words 'or of the Sons of Veterans,' and also by
5 inserting after the word "Republic" in the sixth line
6 thereof the words 'or the Sons of Veterans,' so that said
7 chapter as amended shall read as follows:

‘Any person who shall wilfully wear the badge of the
9 Grand Army of the Republic, or of the Sons of Veterans,
10 or who shall use or wear the same to obtain aid or assist-
11 ance thereby within this State, unless he shall be entitled
12 to use or wear the same under the rules and regulations
13 of the Department of Maine, Grand Army of the
14 Republic, or of the Sons of Veterans, shall be guilty of
15 misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by
16 imprisonment for a term not to exceed thirty days in the
17 county jail, or a fine not to exceed twenty dollars, or by
18 both such fine and imprisonment.’
