STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT additional to and amendatory of Chapter two hundred and thirty-four of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, relating to Fraternal Beneficiary Organizations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section three of chapter two hundred and thirty-four of 2 the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine is 3 hereby amended by leaving out all after the word "afore-4 said" in the first line, to the word "and" in the fourth 5 line; also by leaving out all after the word "member" in 6 the twenty-first line to the word "may" in the twenty-7 fourth line and inserting the following : 'Any corporation

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8 authorized to transact business as defined in this act; 9 and by striking out the words "one dollar" in the last 10 line and inserting therefor the words 'two dollars;' so 11 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

Any corporation duly organized as afore-Section 3. 13 said, and which conducts its business as a fraternal society on the lodge system, or limits its certificate holders to a 14 particular order, class or fraternity, or to the employes 15 of a particular town or city, designated firm, business 16 house or corporation, may provide in its by-laws for the 17 payment, from time to time, of a fixed sum by each 18 member, and from this income may make weekly or other 19 payments to any member during a period of disability of 20such member. Such corporation may also provide in its 21 22 by-laws for the payment, from time to time, of a fixed 23 sum by each member to be paid to the beneficiaries of deceased members, in such amount and manner as shall 24 be fixed by said by-laws and written in the benefit certifi-25cates issued to such members, and payable to the husband, 26 27 wife, children, relatives of, or persons dependent upon $\mathbf{28}$ such member; but no contract under this act shall be 29 valid or legal which shall be conditional upon an agreement or understanding that the beneficiary shall pay the 30 31 dues and assessments, or either of them, for said member. Any corporation authorized to transact business as defined 3233 in this act may employ paid agents in soliciting business. But no person shall act as such an agent until he has first 34 been licensed therefor by the insurance commissioner in 35 accordance with the provisions of section seventy-three. 36 chapter forty-nine of the Revised Statutes, and any per-37 38 sons violating this provision shall, upon conviction, be 39 punished as provided in said section seventy-three. For40 such license the commissioner shall receive two dollars.'
