STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Perham Plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and thirty-three
2 dollars and fifty-four cents be and hereby is appropriated
3 for the purpose of reimbursing Perham plantation for
4 excessive taxation, caused by the over estimate of said
5 plantation by the State in the year 1890.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The valuation commission of 1890 made a mistake in fixing the valuation of Perham plantation and acknowledged that it ought to have been different, but too late to have the figures changed.

The State assessors had a hearing upon the matter in the summer of 1891 and having fixed the valuation of the township at \$24,248 less than that fixed by the valuation commission the plantation ask that the excess tax paid for the years 1891-2 be refunded.
