STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to regulate the taking of fish from Johnson brook,
so called, in the towns of Burnham, in the county of
Waldo; Pittsfield, in the county of Somerset, and Clinton,
in the county of Kennebec.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from
2 taking or catching any fish from the waters of John-
3 son brook, so called, situated in the towns of Burn-
4 ham, in the county of Waldo; Pittsfield, in the county of
5 Somerset, and Clinton in the county of Kennebec, between

6 the twentieth day of June and the first day of April fol-
7 lowing of any year or years.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions
2 of this act shall be punished by a fine of five dollars, and
3 an additional fine of one dollar for each fish so taken, to
4 be recovered on complaint before any trial justice or other
5 court in said counties of Waldo, Somerset or Kennebec,
6 one-half to the use of the complainant and the other half
7 to the use of the county wherein the offense was com-
8 mitted.
