STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT additional to Section nine of Chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, relating to Days of Grace.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Four days of grace are allowed on any promissory note,

- 2 inland bill of exchange, draft or order for the payment of
- 3 money payable in this State at a future day, or at sight,
- 4 and not on demand, if the third day of grace is the
- 5 first Monday in September.

If the third day of grace on any such note, bill, draft

- 7 or order is the Sunday before the first Monday in Sep-
- 8 tember, two days of grace are allowed.
