STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking of trout in Seven Ponds (so
called), in Franklin County.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION. 1. No person shall catch, kill or destroy any
2 trout in Seven Ponds (so called), in Number three (3),
3 Range five (5), in Franklin county, from the first day of
4 October until the first day of May annually.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions
2 of this act shall pay a fine of ten dollars, and one dollar
3 for each and every trout so taken, killed or destroyed, to

4 be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in
5 Franklin county, one-half to the complainant and one-half
6 to the county.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
