STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking of fish in any manner through
the ice in Long, Cow and Greely Ponds.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. No person shall fish through the ice in
2 Long, Cow or Greely ponds for a term of five years.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions
2 of this act shall pay a fine of ten dollars, and one dollar
3 for every trout so taken to be recovered on complaint before
4 any trial justice in Franklin county, one-half to the com-
5 plainant and one-half to the county.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
