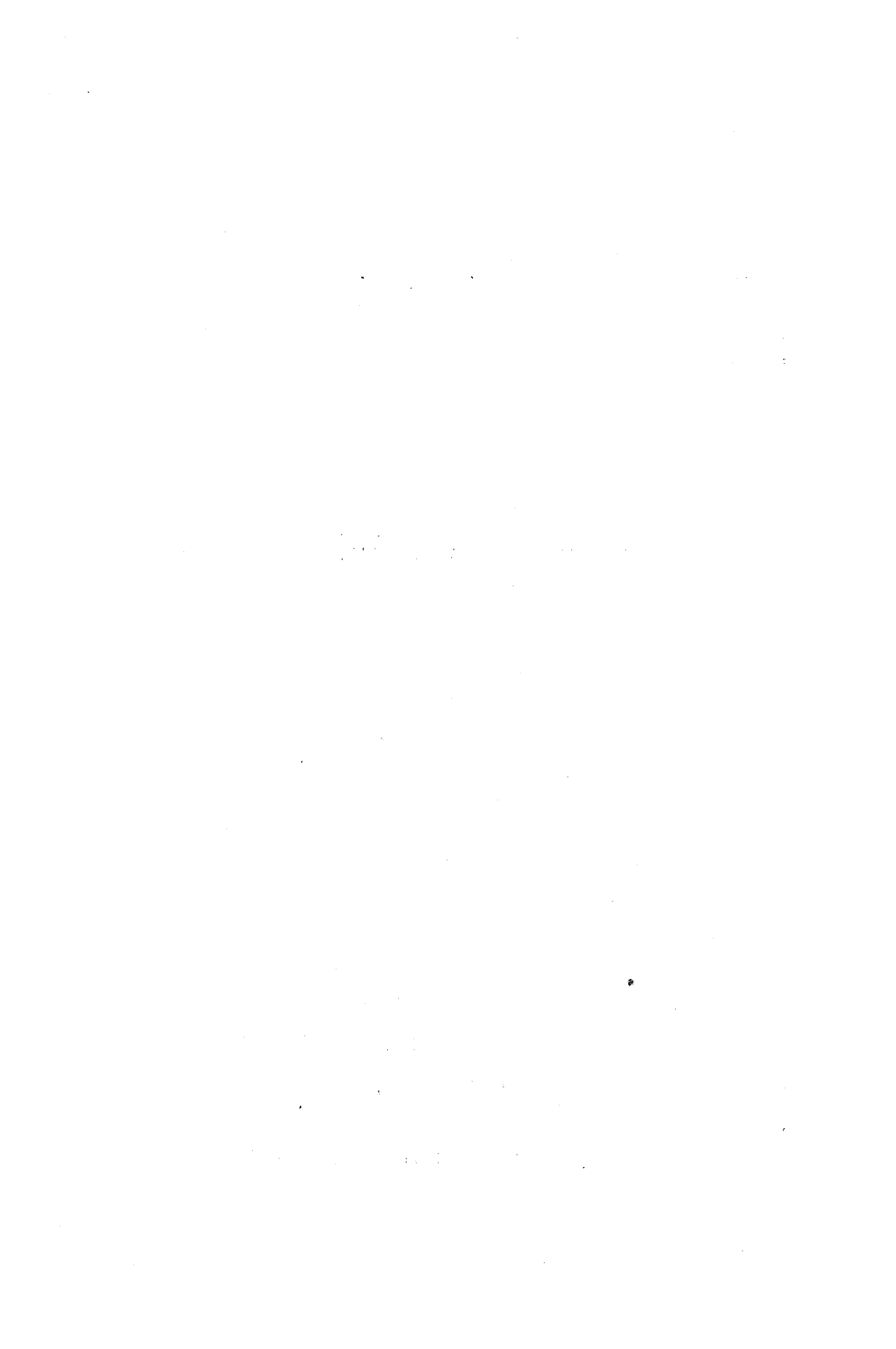
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT amendatory of and additional to Chapter 137 of
the Public Laws of 1887, relating to Disclosures of Poor
Debtors.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. If the debtor, after being duly served with
2 subpoena, transfers, conceals or otherwise disposes of any
3 real or personal property owned by, or any claims, rights,
4 credits or sums of money due said debtor, unless upon or-
5 der of the commissioner issuing said subpoena, he shall not
6 be entitled to the benefit of the oath provided in section
7 eight of said chapter.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
