STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to prohibit fishing through the ice in Sandy River
Ponds and Long Pond in Franklin County.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from
2 fishing in any manner through the ice in any of the Sandy
3 River Ponds in Sandy River Plantation, so called, and
4 Long Pond in Sandy River Plantation and Greenvale
5 Plantation, so called, in Franklin county for six years.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions
2 of this act shall be liable to a penalty of ten dollars, for
3 the offence, and a further penalty of one dollar for each

4 fish so taken to be recovered on complaint, before any
5 trial justice or other court, in said county of Franklin,
6 one-half to the use of the complainant, and the other half
7 to the use of said county.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
