STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Section 76 of Chapter 86 of the Revised
Statutes, relating to Judgment against Trustee.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section seventy-six of chapter eighty-six of the Revised
2 Statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof
3 the following: 'Such payment, delivery or accounting
4 for may be made either to the officer holding the execu-
5 tion or to the plaintiff or his attorney of record, and may
6 be proved by the officer's return upon the execution, by
7 endorsement made thereon by the plaintiff or his attorney
8 of record,' or by any other competent evidence, so that
9 said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Section 76. The judgment against any person as
11 trustee discharges him from all demands by the principal
12 defendant or his executors or administrators, for all goods,
13 effects and credits, paid, delivered, or accounted for by
14 the trustee thereon; and if he is afterwards sued for the
15 same by the defendant or his executors or administrators,
16 such judgments and disposal of the goods, effects and
17 credits as above stated, being proved, shall be a bar to
18 the action for the amount so paid or delivered by him.
19 Such payment, delivery or accounting for may be made
20 either to the officer holding the execution or to the
21 plaintiff or his attorney of record, and may be proved
22 by the officer’s return upon the execution, by endorse-
23 ment made thereon by the plaintiff or his attorney of
24 record, or by any other competent evidence.’
