STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, providing for State Pensions for Invalid Soldiers and Sailors who served on the quota of Maine in the War of Eighteen Hundred and Sixty-One, their Widows and Orphans and the Dependent Children, Parents and Sisters of Soldiers and Sailors.

Resolved, That the sum of sixty-five thousand dollars
2 be and is hereby appropriated to provide for State pensions
3 for invalid soldiers and sailors who served in the war of
4 eighteen hundred and sixty-one on the quota of Maine,
5 their widows and orphans and the dependent children,
6 parents and sisters of solders and sailors for the year
7 eighteen hundred and ninety-three and sixty thousand
8 dollars for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four.
