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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED  
AND NINETY-THREE.

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AN ACT to enlarge the powers of the Saccarappa Grammar  
School Association.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. The board of trustees, originally organized  
2 and now existing at Westbrook, in the county of Cum-  
3 berland, by the name of the Saccarappa Grammar School  
4 Association, under the provisions of an act of the general  
5 court of Massachusetts, approved the twentieth day of  
6 February, eighteen hundred and fifteen, and entitled "An  
7 Act to incorporate the Saccarappa Grammar School Asso-  
8 ciation," said board of trustees consisting at the present  
9 time of Leander Valentine, James Pennell, Fabius M.  
10 Ray, John E. Warren and Woodbury K. Dana, are

11 hereby continued a body corporate and politic under the  
12 name aforesaid, and as such are authorized and empow-  
13 ered, in addition to the powers which they already possess,  
14 to take and hold by purchase, gift, devise, or bequest,  
15 real and personal estate, in all not exceeding in value one  
16 hundred thousand dollars, owned at any one time, and  
17 use and dispose thereof, for such school or educational  
18 purposes, not inconsistent with the purposes of the  
19 original incorporation, as to said trustees, or their suc-  
20 cessors in office shall, from time to time, seem advisable.  
21 All the acts of said trustees, heretofore, in purchasing  
22 and holding real estate are hereby legalized and made  
23 valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
