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## STATE OF MAINE.

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RESOLVE in relation to the Maine Insane Hospital.

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*Resolved,* That the governor and council and trustees of  
2 the Maine Insane Hospital be and are hereby directed to  
3 take into consideration the condition of that portion of  
4 the patients of the insane hospital, that may appear to  
5 belong to an idiotic and demented class, who are entirely  
6 incurable, particularly those that are harmless, with a  
7 view to separate such class of persons from the hospital,  
8 in order that the accommodations of the hospital may  
9 meet the present and future demands of insane persons,  
10 by the withdrawal of the first class from the hospital to  
11 their proper home or asylum.

*Resolved,* That the governor and council and trustees of  
13 the Maine Insane Hospital are further directed, first, to  
14 ascertain the exact number of the idiotic and demented

15 persons now in the hospital, and to report their condition,  
16 and to further examine into the expediency of constructing  
17 additional wings or buildings, and the cost of the same,  
18 for the accommodation of the above class, on the grounds  
19 of the Maine Insane Hospital in Augusta, and report to  
20 the next legislature.
