STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to incorporate the Bridgton Farmers' and Me-
chanics' Club.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Isaiah S. Webb, Samuel S. Fuller, Robert
2 A. Barnard, Eben A. Cross, Frank A. Libby, Ruel A.
3 Dodge, Albert A. Ingalls, Charles O. Kilborn, Frank D.
4 Moulton, Benjamin F. Milliken, Albert B. Kilborn,
5 Thomas Smith, William A. Richardson, Alvin G. Morri-
6 son, Thomas Miller, Cyrus C. Johnson, Austin Brigham,
7 Albert J. Roes, Lyman Bradstreet, and their associates,
8 successors and assigns, be and hereby are, made a body
9 politic and corporate by the name of the Bridgton Far-
10 mers' and Mechanics' Club, with its principal place of

11 business located at Bridgton, in the county of Cumber-
12 land and State of Maine, for the purpose of promoting
13 and improving generally agriculture, horticulture, stock
14 raising, breeding and raising of all animals, the mechanic
15 arts, and manufactures connected therewith. Said cor-
16 poration shall have the power to make such by-laws and
17 regulations, not inconsistent with the constitution and
18 laws of the State of Maine as it may deem necessary for
19 the management of its affairs, and in general shall have
20 and exercise all the powers and privileges incident and
21 generally granted to similar corporations.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation shall not
2 exceed the sum of fifteen thousand dollars and shall be
3 fixed at the first meeting of the corporation, and may be
4 thereafter increased to a sum not exceeding said sum of
5 fifteen thousand dollars and shall be divided into shares of
6 five dollars each.

SECT. 3. Said corporation shall have power to hold by
2 purchase, lease, devise, bequest or gift, real estate, not
3 exceeding in value, exclusive of improvements, the sum of
4 ten thousand dollars, and personal property, not exceed-
5 ing in value the sum of five thousand dollars.

SECT. 4. Said corporation shall have all of the police
2 powers, together with all other powers and privileges, at
3 all its exhibitions of what ever kind, which are conferred
4 upon agricultural societies by sections sixteen, seventeen
5 and eighteen of chapter fifty-eight of the Revised Statutes,
6 and any amendments thereof and additions thereto, and

7 the prohibitions, restrictions, forfeitures and penalties
8 provided by section nineteen of said chapter fifty-eight
9 shall be applicable to all exhibitions of this corporation.

SECT. 5. The first meeting of said corporation may be
2 called by a written notice thereof, signed by any corpora-
3 tor herein named, served upon each corporator by giving
4 him the same in hand, or by leaving the same at his last
5 and usual place of abode, seven days, at least, before the
6 time of meeting.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.
